"BACK TO CHURCH" POTLUCK, CAT SURVEY, HMPC MISSION STUDY



Dear HMPC Friends & Family,

August brings butterflies, katydids and cicadas, dog days as well as a few yellow leaves and surprisingly cool mornings to remind us that seasons are transitioning. I know many of you welcome the end of fogged up windows on humid mornings and

the arrival of sweater weather. At the same time, may all of you carry memories of special summer times – camps, retreats, beaches and mountains, family time or tours of special places – that will remind you how blessed and abundant life can be.



As the traditional school calendar tells us, with "back to school" comes a sense of "back to work." I've also always thought of the Sunday


after Labor Day as "National Back to Church Day." That's September 7 this year. We're inviting all of you and anyone who wants to celebrate that day – back to church, back to hope and community and love. No classes will be held, only a big ol' fried chicken lunch with potluck sides after worship in Westminster. Good food, reconnection, and learning what your giving will bring in the fall programming will make for a great celebration.



But speaking of back to work – if you receive the invitation to take the Congregational Assessment Tool (CAT) starting August 24, please do put that

bit of work on your calendar and make sure it's done by September 14. You have three weeks to get it done! We hope we'll receive at least 150 responses – about as many cat pictures as we received this summer – but if you want to overachieve, make it 200! Your results will be interpreted by Holy Cow! Consultants with members of the Mission Study Team (MST) and Session in Westminster on Saturday, October 4. On October 30, the MST will share the most impactful findings with you on a congregational Zoom.

Also, mark your calendars for September 21 at 5:00pm, when the MST will share the most intriguing results from their demographic, community interview, and HMPC financial analysis research. We have all been surprised – and affirmed – by what we're learning and can't wait to share it with you for continued conversation and discernment. In November, we will use all this information in our common work of creating a vision statement and goals and objectives. NOTE: our COMMON work. The MST doesn't create the vision statement -- it will hone all the input that YOU provide on November 9. The MST also doesn't create the goals and objectives to work toward the vision: those of you attending worship on November 23 will create these and discuss priorities. The MST must organize and report on activities that YOU do to discern God's vision for HMPC in the near future.



Questions You Might Have About the CAT



The church will soon send out a link to a survey called the Congregational Assessment Tool (CAT) that we are using to gather information about the church's health and priorities. There will be detailed instructions in the email

accompanying the link. The Mission Study Team has already customized the survey to fit our congregation. There will be a congregational meeting on Zoom on October 30 to discuss the results of our CAT.

WUWTW uses an ancient study method called *lectio divina*. We read the passage that is preached on for the

upcoming Sunday four times, with interspersed questions: What's a word or phrase that stands out to you? Allow that word or phrase to develop into a memory from your life, a thought you have on the passage or a metaphor? What is Christ calling you to through the passage?

No previous Bible study experience is necessary. At inperson meetings we provide coffee and Bibles. On Zoom we invite you to use an online Bible or pull out your own hard copy and brew some joe at home. It's a great way to deepen your faith and develop friendships within the church! New participants are always welcome.
