Belonging By Giving of Your Time

The obvious part of our mission is to encourage you to financially support the ministries of the church, but there is more to it than that.

Over the next week or so, you should get one of our 2022 pledge brochures in the mail. They will also be available in the pews and in the church office. On the back, you will find a new section titled Time and Talent. There is a list of twenty-eight areas of interest and a write-in line for "other". We are asking you to make a pledge of your self to some ministry of the church. We hope that this will be in addition to your financial pledge, but even if you can't commit financially, you can offer your time.

Mac has a very simple formula for getting connected and staying connected to the Hudson community. First, attend worship regularly. Congratulations. You are off to a good start.

Second. Find a small group activity that feeds your spirit. I enjoy the Waking With the Word men's bible study. We meet every Tuesday morning at 6:30, alternating weeks between in person and Zoom. The conversations are both challenging and uplifting, and I've gotten to really know some people that I never would have known otherwise. Let Mac if you'd like to get on that email list.

Third. Share your talent in some ministry of the church. I developed an unexpected talent while serving on the Memorial Garden Committee. I learned how to



prepare and close the niches in the columbarium when we place the remains of a loved one there. I've been doing that for seventeen years and it gives me a real sense of purpose to play a small role in that process.

The scripture we chose to accompany our theme of Belonging is Nehemiah 10:35, "We obligate ourselves to bring the first fruits of our soil and the first fruits of all fruit of every tree, year by year, to the house of the Lord". We obligate ourselves ... year by year. It is a choice. A good choice. I'm Fred Woodward and, for me, belonging to Hudson means being part of a larger purpose. Thank you.

COVID 19 Hudson's Current Policies

The below policies have been set or reviewed by Session, the COVID-19 Sub Team, Personnel Committee or the Hudson Memorial Preschool Board. All below policies are subject to change.

- Church staff can work from the office or at home.
- For preschool drop off, no parents come inside the building.
- The preschool is following NCDHHS tool kit and guidance.
- Groups of any size can gather outside without masks. Eating outside on church property is permitted.
- Masks are required at all times inside the church building. Exceptions to this are:
 - Vaccinated speakers, soloists and small singing groups in worship who are appropriately socially distant from the congregation.

- Staff who are working alone in their office.
- Sunday worship children's message volunteers must wear masks when giving their talk because the children are not socially distant from the speaker.
- Employees of HMPC (church and preschool) are required to provide proof of their COVID-19 vaccination to their supervisor.
- Any volunteer working with children 12 and under at HMPC will be required to provide proof of their COVID-19 vaccination to the Interim Director of Children and Family Ministries or the Interim Director of Youth Ministries prior to volunteering with children 12 and under.
- Groups are not allowed to eat together inside the church buildings. The exception to this rule is preschool children have lunch and snack time in their class bubble.

• What is a word or phrase that stands out to you?


• Allow that word or phrase to develop into a memory from your life, a though on the passage or metaphor
