Volunteers from this congregation will once again foray this summer to Banner Elk, NC, to work on homes for Avery County Habitat for Humanity. The group will go to Banner Elk on Sunday afternoon, July 19, and after a week of engagement will return on Friday afternoon, July 25. Banner Elk is approximately a 3 ½ - hour drive from Raleigh, close enough that working a part-week is easily possible as a participant's schedule may require.

Our volunteers will room and board at the Guenther Lodge of the Holston Presbyterian Camp and Retreat Center in Banner Elk. Guenther offers nine rooms with two double beds and a private bath, plus additional bedrooms with twin beds accessible to ample bathroom facilities if our company needs more accommodation.



With these opportunities and facilities, a large group of men and women can be usefully engaged and fully accommodated each day. Our nights will offer fulfilling togetherness and pleasant camaraderie including a gathering for evening Vespers. Please consider joining us on this Mission in the Mountains. No specific skills are necessary, and inexperience is not a barrier. Teens and friends are welcome too.

Meet Property Team Member, Bob Stowe



Bob Stowe helps to ensure that our building is prepared in case an emergency ever arises - checking fire extinguishers, testing the elevator, managing the first aid kits, and more. What you may not know is that his career gave him valuable experience for this service to the church. Read our interview with Bob to learn more!

Q: How did you first get connected with HMPC?

A: My wife, Iva, and I moved to Raleigh in March of 2022 and started an internet search of churches for consideration. We visited another church along with Hudson and felt led to Hudson with no regrets.

Q: What roles do you fill at HMPC?

A: I currently serve on the Property Committee, Adult Education Committee, and Technology Team, taking my turn as a camera operator for livestreaming. I'm also in the teaching rotation for the Seekers Sunday School class.

Q: Please tell us about your career background. Has your field experience influenced the way you see the world?

A: I worked in Human Resources management in various manufacturing operations. In addition to HR management, I usually had responsibility for safety, environmental compliance, security, community relations, and legal compliance. In all these functions, I learned the best practice is to do things right - the first time - especially safety.

Q: Was there an event that drove your focus on safety?

A: Without a doubt - the 1991 fire at Imperial Foods in Hamlet, NC, that killed 25 and seriously injured 54. I was working in a manufacturing facility about 30 miles away. Although I was not associated with that event, it increased my safety awareness. Two recent news events continue to remind me that you can't neglect safety - the floods in TX last year that claimed the lives of young girls, and the New Year's fire in Europe that killed multiple people, including children.

Q: What is one safety tip you would like all people to know?

A: Situational awareness! Be aware of your surroundings - the nearest exit, changing traffic patterns, developing weather, etc.

No previous Bible study experience is necessary. At in-person meetings we provide coffee and Bibles. On Zoom we invite you to use an online Bible or pull out your own hard copy and brew some joe at home. It's a great way to deepen your faith and develop friendships within the church! What Did the CAT Tell Us about Readiness for Ministry?

The Congregational Assessment Tool, that over 200 of us completed in September, told us many things about the current state of our church and our hopes for the future. The Mission Study Team is continuing to share these results to increase the congregation's understanding and to encourage involvement during this time of transition.

The background for the CAT questions on readiness of congregation members for ministry was described in the full report given to the MST and Session. It reads, in part, **"... all members of a church are called to ministry, and it is the responsibility of the church to help members identify their gifts and connect to ministries that best fit those gifts."**

Three-quarters of Hudson respondents agreed that our church helps members discern their gifts and understand that we are all called to ministry. Responses showed, in addition, that members agree that the church provides opportunities to serve and supports members in service. The score in the area of "Readiness for Ministry" is higher at Hudson than at many churches that have participated in the survey. We are proud of all our lay leaders and participants in ministry!

Are you looking for deeper involvement in the life and ministry of Hudson? Spring is the season when our church elects new officers and seeks to involve members in committee service. After reflecting on your gifts and interests, if you feel called to serve in areas such as mission, children and youth, worship and music, fellowship, property, or Christian education, please contact the pastor or current committee chairs or members.
