Deepening Discipleship & Faith Through Your Church Community



Last Sunday, June 18th, I started a sermon series on a section from our denominational constitution (*The Book of Order*) called "The Ministry of Members". I think it is a wonderful guide for us that describes what discipleship in Christ looks like. In my sermon, I shared what the meanings of the

original New Testament Greek word for *disciple* are: A scholastic, schoolish word meaning "to make a student of", to "bring to school", to "educate", to "mentor", or to "apprentice".

This summer I would love for us to be students of this section of *The Book of Order*. Take a moment to read the passage on the right.



My suggestion to you is to tear or cut out this section of the newsletter and tuck this wonderful reminder of discipleship in your Bible. Ask yourself during quiet times some of the following questions: Which of these ministries do I do well? Which do I need to grow in? Which of these scare me? Which do I need to learn more about?

I look forward to thinking through these with you in worship and in conversation. Let's deepen our discipleship together!







Hands-on Mission Event 500 BREAKFAST BAGS FOR MEALS-ON-WHEELS

Last Sunday during the Summer Series, we packed 500 breakfast bags for Meals on Wheels! MOW clients receive one meal a day and the breakfast bags are a very welcome addition. The food was purchased by the Mission Committee from designated Hunger Action funds.











Summer Project for the Food Bank

We know that many of you are unable to volunteer at the Food Bank, so we have an opportunity for something you can do right here at church!

One of the things we do at the Food Bank is to sort the thousands of pounds of produce that come in every day. After sorting, the sweet potatoes, squash, etc. are packed into 5lb mesh bags and distributed to organizations providing direct service to those in need, including the North Raleigh Ministry Food Pantry. Those mesh bags start out on a large spool, where they are cut and tied to be ready to hold the produce. The Food Bank uses thousands of these every week!

For the next few weeks, under the windows in Westminster North, you will find a spool of red mesh next to a table with instructions for the bags, the length for each bag marked on the table, and a plastic bin with sharp scissors to cut the bags. Whenever you are here, you are invited to make a few bags! After church fellowship, Summer Suppers, or if you have some time during office hours and the space is not otherwise being used, stop by and help with the project!

This is a simple thing to do, and an important one, as you can imagine each and every bag filled with healthy produce for people who would otherwise be unable to have it. It is much appreciated, and saves the Food Bank a great deal of money by not having to purchase the bags ready-to-use.


June 25 - Part 1 Sin, Guilt & Responsibility in the Bible & Today
