# ADVENT BEGINS THIS SUNDAY, DECEMBER 3 What is God Like?

Friends, we welcome you to the church Season of Advent. Our *Presbyterian Book of Common Worship (2018)* says:


"Advent means coming or arrival. This word has a double significance, as in Advent we celebrate Christ's coming into the world and look with longing for his coming again. The season of Advent begins with an emphasis on final things (eschatology). We watch and pray with expectant hope for the establishment of God's justice and the return of the Prince of Peace. As the weeks of Advent progress, the focus shifts to thanks and praise for the birth of the one who has already come—Jesus Christ, our Savior. The origin of the season of Advent is uncertain. It may have been patterned after the season of Lent as a period of penitence before Christmas, or as a time of preparation for baptism at Epiphany."

Hudson's theme this Advent is "What Is God Like?" This idea came from a magazine issue of *Reformed Worship* (September 2022) by Matt Ackerman & Bailey Carver Attema. They based some of this series on a children's book by Rachel Held Evans & Matthew Paul Turner entitled *What Is God Like?* At the beginning of their article they write,

"During Advent we anticipate Christ's coming as an infant as well as Christ's return, when the earth will be renewed and all will be well. We should be startled and amazed by that reality - that Christ, a member of the Trinity, God's own self, came down from heaven to earth. What kind of God does that? Who is this God that became like one of us? What is God like?"

During worship each week during Advent, we will be looking at different attributes of God: God is like a **Fort**,

like a **Gardener**, like **Light**, and like a **River**. To supplement this, we have asked members of this congregation to answer the question, "What is God like?" Their thoughts and reflections are included in a daily devotional booklet that will be available at the church this Sunday or you can download a digital copy <a href="here">here</a>. We trust the Spirit will move you each day as you reflect with fellow church members about their understanding of God.

As we enter another Advent season, the season evokes many feelings, images, memories, and stories. We may be filled with excited anticipation or anxious dread. For many of us, the season is a mixture of both. The frenetic pace of the holidays may cause the time to pass quickly, while the extended hours of darkness can make days seem endless. Each moment is unique as winter's changing lights that cast shadows inviting us into the sacred presence of God.

To assist us in framing our Advent journeys, the Deacons are leading a special worship service on Sunday, December 3, in the Chapel at 6:00pm. 


# 2024 Pledge Campaign **Progress Update**

AS OF NOVEMBER 30, 2023



Thank you to all who have submitted your pledges thus far. Collectively, our pledges provide our Finance Committee and Session with vital information as they work to prepare our 2024 budget.

As of November 30, 2023, our received pledges total \$763,171 (still \$62k away from our goal of \$825k). We currently have 161 households who have submitted pledges--Last year we had a total of 185 pledging households.


come to share how these themes have informed your Advent experiences in the past and in the coming season. Advent is the beginning of the liturgical year in Western Christianity.

# Scholarships Available THROUGH PW

The Presbyterian Women offer two scholarships every year. Starting January 1, both PW college and campership scholarship applications will be open. The deadline for submission is March 1st. They do require letters of recommendation.

To apply for the campership scholarship, Youth (for grades 6 through 12) must live in the Presbytery and be a member of a church in the Presbytery. Campers may attend the camp/youth event of their choice, but preference may be given to those who are attending a Presbyterian-related camp. Value of the campership is \$250.

To apply for the college scholarship, applicants must live in the Presbytery and be a member of a church in the Presbytery. Applicants may attend the college of their choice, but preference may be given to those applicants who are attending a Presbyterian-related college. The amount awarded depends on the funds available and number of awards.
