## Visit the Chapel for Prayer & Reflection This Advent Season

Rich Richards, Director of Youth and Children's Music Ministries, created an art installation in the Chapel. Throughout Advent, you are invited to stop by the Chapel, sit with the liturgical installation, and rest in "the sacred presence of God breathing in the shadows."

#### Here is a description of the artwork:

#### "Seasonal Tzelem and the Most High"


Found objects, window panes and light sources Rich Richards (2023)

During this time of year, looking through windows both physically and metaphorically, is commonplace. "Seasonal Tzelem and the Most High" is a liturgical art installation that attempts to illustrate the idea of time, pace, feelings, images, memories, and stories of past and present while using ancient text. The Hebrew word for "shadows" is Tzelem or in modern Hebrew, Tzel. This word is used in Psalm 91:1-2 to create an image of safety and security, but the literal translation is "image" and "dark". The Hebrew word for *Tzelem* is found on the walls and ceilings of the Chapel to not only illustrate a "shadow", but also to connect us to the original language of the text. The found objects in this installation are intended to stir up some of those deep. warm memories that many experience during this season.



This prayer may be helpful as you spend quiet time in the space:

Eternal God, during this season of Advent, help us prepare Christ's way. Help us center our hearts, minds, and prayers on your holy presence in our midst. As the days grow short and the nights loom long, we praise you for these seasonal reminders that there is time for work and for rest. As we contemplate the vulnerability of Christ, born a fragile infant in a violent world, let us drop our facades and the masks we hide behind. May this season of Advent prepare us to celebrate the strength that can be found in weakness and the power held in humility and love. May it be so. Amen.

## **End-of-Year Gifts for** 2023 Giving Statements



As you consider your end-of-year giving, we want to make you aware of IRS guidelines that allow for a donation to be included on your 2023 giving statement for tax purposes. Simply dating a check in December is insufficient according to the IRS guidelines – therefore please consider the following deadlines:

- Given in the offering plate: by Dec 31
- Hand delivered to the office: by Dec 31
- **US Mail: Postmarked by Dec 31**
- Private delivery service (FedEx/UPS): Received in office by Dec 31
- Online credit card gifts: must "fully process" by credit card issuer no later than Dec 31 - we recommend that you initiate an online gift by Dec 21 to allow 5 business days for transaction to fully process by year end.
- Stock donations: received in the church's brokerage account by Dec 29 - we recommend you initiate a stock transfer by Dec 21 to allow 5 business days.




## 2024 Pledge Campaign **Progress Update**

Thank you to all who have submitted your pledges thus far. Collectively, our pledges provide our Finance Committee and Session with vital information as they work to prepare our 2024 budget.

As of December 14, 2023, our received pledges total \$768,571 (still \$56k away from our goal of \$825k). We currently have 164 households who have submitted pledges--Last year we had a total of 185 pledging households.
