

## SEPTEMBER IS HUNGER ACTION MONTH!

North Carolina is experiencing its worst hunger crisis in nearly 20 years, with food insecurity at an all-time high. Over 607,000 people in the Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina's 34-county service area are **now food insecure**, an increase of almost 47,000 from the previous year. Their primary concern is the federal cuts for food assistance programs. The federal budget for our local food bank (FBCENC) has dropped drastically. They have been forced to layoff employees to keep food available for those in our community who need it.

Marco Rodriguez, Director of Volunteer Engagement, explained that volunteers are crucial for warehouse operations to ensure timely food distribution. Without sufficient volunteer hours, food cannot reach those in need efficiently.

Recent federal budget legislation is poised to deliver a significant blow to food assistance programs in North Carolina, potentially leaving over a million residents facing increased food insecurity, including a large number of children and seniors.

"The North Hills area has pulled in so many younger professionals looking for connection. The potential for community and faith development/organizing is huge."





### Waking Up With The Word

Men's Bible Study Every Tuesday at 6:30am Meeting Location Alternates Weekly on Zoom & In-person on the Westminster Hall Patio



This is an early morning men's Bible study. It meets via Zoom and in-person (on the WH Patio), alternating weekly.

WUWTW uses an ancient study method called *lectio divina*. We read the passage that is preached on for the upcoming Sunday four times, with interspersed auestions:

What's a word or phrase that stands out to you? Allow that word or phrase to develop into a memory from your life, a thought you have on the passage or a metaphor? What is Christ calling you to through the passage?

No previous Bible study experience is necessary. At inperson meetings we provide coffee and Bibles. On Zoom we invite you to use an online Bible or pull out your own hard copy and brew some joe at home. It's a great way to deepen your faith and develop friendships within the church! New participants are always welcome.


## Adult Ed on Sundays


### PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN
