Palm Sunday - April 10 10:30am – Hudson Sanctuary



This is the day we celebrate Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Children are invited to meet in the Narthex and process in during the opening hymn. All worshipers will receive a palm branch.

Maundy Thursday - April 14

Tenebrae & Communion Service 7:00pm - Hudson Sanctuary

Maundy Thursday (from mandatum, Latin for "commandment") proclaims Jesus' new commandment to love one another as he has loved us. It celebrates Christ's example of humble service and self-offering, represented by the washing

of feet and the sharing of communion. The liturgy includes the Lord's Supper and readings. The service utilizes candle light, song and silence.

Good Friday - April 15 **Noon - Hudson Sanctuary**

On Good Friday, the horror of Jesus' death cannot be denied, and as the story unfolds each year we hear the text in fresh ways depending on where life finds us. Good Friday marks the crucifixion and dying of Christ when we reflect upon Christ's sacrifice for our sins and worship in community as we consider what Jesus' death means. This is a contemplative service with simple liturgy and reflective music when we are invited to consider what hope looks like in our darkest hours.

Easter - April 17

Ecumenical Sunrise Service - 7:00 am Diab Amphitheater at St. Timothy's School

The Six Forks Churches that came together for the Community Thanksgiving Service are coming together again for a joint, informal, outdoor Easter service. This special service brings together St. Mark's United Methodist, St. Timothy's Episcopal, North Haven Church, The Fountain, Grace Lutheran, Trinity Baptist, and Hudson Memorial Presbyterian. Ministers from each of these congregations will be participating in the



liturgy. If you plan on attending, you can enter the amphitheater area at the corner of Rowan and Gates Streets. You can park in North Hills shopping area or on the street where appropriate.

Conversations for Lent


Final Sunday - April 10



Habitat Interfaith Build April 30, May 1, June 4

There are still dates left to volunteer with the 2022 Interfaith Build!

For those who may not be familiar, Habitat for Humanity was founded on a commitment to racial equity, reconciliation, and justice. It is a Christian-based organization that seeks to put God's love into action, working with and serving people of all different faiths and walks of life to fulfill its vision of a world in which all God's children have a safe place to live.

Hudson Memorial has a long history with Habitat of Wake County since 1998, when we were the first church to individually sponsor a home. In all these years, we have participated in countless builds, and a decade ago participated in an Abraham Build with members of the Jewish, Islamic and Christian communities. Out of that shared experience was born the Interfaith Coalition which includes more faith communities and groups who share the core belief that loving our neighbor requires commitment to people who are in most need.

HMPC members have found the Interfaith Build a wonderful opportunity to establish relationships with our coalition members as we work alongside one another. This year's coalition participants are: Islamic Association of Raleigh, Sikh Community, Beth Meyer Synagogue, St. Paul's Christian Church, Raleigh Mennonite Church, Highland United Methodist Church, Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Raleigh, Jewish Family Services, Temple Beth Or, Hudson Memorial Presbyterian Church, Unity of the Triangle, Triangle Interfaith Alliance, First Church of Christ Scientist, Hindu Society, Kadampa Center and Sai Center.

Responding to the Crisis Volunteer at the Food Bank in Ukraine **New Dates**

Hudson's Mission Committee has discussed the crisis in Ukraine and how we can respond. Our denomination is already active in this crisis through Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) and long-time partner agencies in Europe.

"Our first priority is to provide funding to these partners on the ground. While the scale of this crisis is new, receiving refugees from Ukraine and other countries in Central and Eastern Europe is not, which means we have trusted, established partners with the knowledge and expertise to carry out this important work."


