




SESSION

FINANCE

First Quarter Financial Summary

The results for the first quarter were mixed. There is a current surplus of \$48K, however, this is significantly less than the \$73K surplus that would be expected at this time of the year. Historically, Hudson accumulates a surplus in the early part of the year because revenue tends to be higher and expenses lower. The surplus typically decreases in the latter part of the year. This is largely due to some members contributing their entire pledge in January. This did not occur to the same extent as previous years, resulting in a revenue shortfall. Expenses, though higher than the previous year, are somewhat lower than anticipated. Actuals for last year at this time are shown for comparison. At this time last year there was a surplus of \$152K.

Hudson is still in a good financial position with strong Foundation assets, a strong and thriving Preschool, a strong cash position, and no mortgage or line of credit balance. Results are less than hoped for at this time without any progress to report in regards to closing the deficit in the budget approved.

Summer Project for the Food Bank

We know that many of you are unable to volunteer at the Food Bank, so we have an opportunity for something you can do right here at church!



One of the things we do at the Food Bank is to sort the

thousands of pounds of produce that come in every day. After sorting, the sweet potatoes, squash, etc. are packed into 5lb mesh bags and distributed to organizations providing direct service to those in need, including the North Raleigh Ministry Food Pantry. Those mesh bags start out on a large spool, where they are cut and tied to be ready to hold the produce. The Food Bank uses thousands of these every week!

For the next few weeks, under the windows in Westminster North, you will find a spool of red mesh next to a table with instructions for the bags, the length for each bag marked on the table, and a plastic bin with sharp scissors to cut the bags. Whenever you are here, you are invited to make a few bags! After church fellowship, Summer Suppers, or if you have some time during office hours and the space is not otherwise being used, stop by and help with the project!

This is a simple thing to do, and an important one, as you can imagine each and every bag filled with healthy produce for people who would otherwise be unable to



have it. It is much appreciated, and saves the Food Bank a great deal of money by not having to purchase the bags ready-touse.


Interfaith Habitat House is Nearing Completion!



FLAT JESUS


Take Flat Jesus With You This Summer!
