"The Matthew 25 Church That Never Was, and The One We Have Today"





One of the primary goals of the Food Bank is to provide the means for everyone to prepare meals that are healthy and cost-effective. To that end, they assist people with learning how to make the most of the many kinds of food they provide, that includes not only those that are non perishable, but also fresh vegetables and fruit, along with refrigerated dairy and meat products. Offering condiments and seasonings enables everyone to enjoy nutritious food that can be prepared in any number of ways that meet a variety of dietary requirements. They suggest the following herbs and seasonings: pepper, cumin, garlic powder, onion powder, Adobo, chicken bouillon, oregano, cinnamon, chili powder, and olive or canola oil.

Registration Info: HMPC women attend as a group and register individually. It works well for us to stay at the Assembly Inn which is centrally located to all activities and accommodates our group eating and sharing the weekend together To register, click on the conference registration link and follow the steps. If you are staying at the Inn, confirm you are registering for the Comprehensive Package. Under Property click Assembly Inn and choose your room preference. There will be a place to note if you have a roommate. Each person registers separately, so be sure you list the other(s) in your room on the form. Full payment is required at registration, \$400-\$500 depending on the room and roommate(s). The Inn typically fills quickly and I encourage you to register as soon as you can. There is a generous refund policy, a full refund less a \$25 service charge through June 25th, and refunds prorated after that, so if you are considering going we suggest you proceed with a reservation and adjust later if necessary. In the comment section, you can note that you are with the Hudson Memorial Presbyterian Church Raleigh group. If the Inn is full when you are registering, the site will direct you to another Montreat property or you can stay elsewhere. You can also be put on a waitlist for the Inn and typically almost everyone on the list gets in. Reach out to Debbie Kirk with questions or for more information as well.






