I wanted to let the congregation know where we are in the mission study phase of the transitional process. The report was initially reviewed by Session on January 4, and their amendments have been incorporated into the next draft. There will be a second review at the January 26th Session meeting for any minor remaining amendments. Minor because we need to submit the final report to Presbytery's Commission on Ministry by February 4 to get on the agenda for the February meeting, so that's a quick turnaround. It's important for us to agree on the final version by that deadline since the Commission doesn't meet during Lent, and we would like to get approval to start forming our Pastor Nominating Committee prior to April.

So please continue to pray for the Mission Study Team members Angie Bell-Morris, Tom Carpenito, Wilson Cheeley, Carol Clemens, Susan Krause, Carolyn Scott, and Marie Wallden, as well as the Session, as they make the final decisions about a document that reveals a snapshot of who Hudson Memorial is right now. Making those statements about our church and community are weighty matters. Please pray that the end result will be good enough to set HMPC in the direction God is asking us to go at this time.

Finally, THANK YOU to all who have pledged your time, talent and treasure for the ministry of this church in 2026. Without it, the hope, peace, joy and love of our gospel message would never happen.



What Did the CAT Tell Us? - Your Suggestions for Worship

Happy New Year from the Mission Study Team! Why are we still talking about the Congregational Assessment Tool? Session will continue to use all the information and opinions gathered over the last half year—CAT, study resources, Zoom calls, Brunch Church ideas for the vision, goals and objectives—to understand how Hudson's members feel now and how we all look at the future of our church.

An intriguing question came at the end of the CAT survey: **“If I could add one thing to worship it would be...”** About half of the CAT respondents provided answers to this question, ranging in length from a single word to a paragraph. Of those, about a third were suggestions about music, with several more on other arts such as visual arts and liturgical dance. Sermon content and other worship elements, such as Communion and use of lay and youth liturgists, taken together, was the second most frequent topic. Examples from the responses, below, show how diverse our opinions can be, which is both a refreshing sign of involvement and vibrancy, and a conundrum for leadership. Obviously, we can't make everyone happy all the time. And we should be most concerned with making God happy. But we benefit from knowing the range of worship elements people most resonate with and try to get creative in responding. When we're doing something in worship you don't like, maybe it's an invitation to practice the grace and tolerance we all insist are so present at the “welcoming church” that members claim HMPC is.

While most changes in worship and other areas of the church will come by action of Session, and many will await the call of a new pastor, ideas and suggestions of all are welcome. As Pastor Marguerite said in a recent sermon, “Nobody is left behind.”

Men's Bible Study Every Tuesday at 6:30am

Meeting Location Alternates Weekly on Zoom & In-person on the Westminster Hall Patio



This is an early morning men's Bible study. It meets via Zoom and in-person (on the WH Patio), alternating weekly.

WUWWTW uses an ancient study method called *lectio divina*. We read the passage that is preached on for the upcoming Sunday four times, with interspersed questions: *What's a word or phrase that stands out to you?* *Allow that word or phrase to develop into a memory from your life, a thought you have on the passage or a metaphor?* *What is Christ calling you to through the passage?*

No previous Bible study experience is necessary. At in-person meetings we provide coffee and Bibles. On Zoom we invite you to use an online Bible or pull out your own hard copy and brew some joe at home. It's a great way to deepen your faith and develop friendships within the church! New participants are always welcome.

The Property Committee is glad to share our December Property Summary to help keep the congregation connected with the care and upkeep of our facilities. This month, we'll first address December's summary and then look at the whole of 2025.

December Property Summary

What did we accomplish in December?

Fire Safety: BFPE addressed a wiring issue in our fire alarm system.

Lighting Improvements: Victory Lights installed new lighting in the downstairs preschool hallway and a new exit sign in the kitchen.

Drainage & Grounds: Millridge completed semi-annual cleaning of our storm drains. Our landscapers prepared our sidewalks for wintery weather. Greg Flueckinger generously volunteered his time to trim bushes and assist with landscaping around campus.

Elevator Maintenance: Schindler completed routine elevator service and repaired a defective button.

Kitchen Equipment: Our ice maker was temporarily down and required replacement of a water valve.

2nd Floor HVAC (Preschool area): A leak became visible in the ceiling of the 2nd-floor library/copy room. It initially looked like plumbing, but the issue was identified as HVAC. A defective part for air handler unit #13 needs replacement. The part is being sourced by TriSouth and we are awaiting its arrival. This work required both a mold assessment and an asbestos assessment to ensure it was safe to work on. (Thank you to Gary Alexander for his support with asbestos testing!)

Restroom Project: The new ADA restroom project continues to move forward and is in the contract negotiation phase.


