

Belonging Through The Music Ministry By Bruce and Carol Cox

Since joining Hudson almost 20 years ago, we have been involved in several committees. But one specific aspect of our relationship with Hudson that has provided us with appreciation and a very strong sense of belonging is the Handbells and Chancel Choir.

Everyone can identify with music to some degree. It is in all of us. A baby often smiles when hearing music. Small children jump and clap. They just plain feel it. We never really lose that bond with music as we age. It grows with us and can boost us on our spiritual journey. Hearing selections like a Brahms lullaby, "Music of the Night", "Fly Me to the Moon", "No Hard Feelings", Boston's "More Than a Feeling", and even "Baby Shark" captures us and reminds us. Hymns like "Jesus Loves Me", "Amazing Grace" and "In Christ Alone", put our prayerful thoughts into word and song. Music can transport us, make us feel things, make worship more meaningful – it connects us to people, emotions, and to God.

We've often heard the expression that a sheet of paper with lines, treble clef, bass clef and notes is just that - a sheet of paper. It is not music until someone plays it on an instrument, or sings it, or hears it, or feels it. Each of these is a gift from God.

While one bell or one vocal may sound nice, when they come together, when the notes are connected and shared, when we gather in community - like in the Chancel Choir or Handbells - that is when it becomes more than "music"! It becomes laughter & joy, care & love, friends & ministry. We are no longer single bells or notes, we are a chorus, a symphony, a family.

Here are a few examples of how our musical family has added to our sense of belonging at Hudson:

- What an honor for Carol to play bells next to Susan Grigg – one of Hudson's original Handbell ringers and a friend of her mother's from college.
- Who is not in awe of watching John Williams? How many bass bells can one-man play? He is a wealth of motion and coordination and truly amazing to watch.
- When you need a happiness boost, there is none better than Lisa Williams. Whether it is playing bells or singing, her cheerfulness and joy are contagious and light up every rehearsal and worship service.
- What would Bruce do without fellow tenor John James? He is so thankful to stand beside him in the choir. Without him, who knows what pitch Bruce might sing!
- Carol Yeargin, who while playing the full accompaniment on a song, still finds a way to somehow emphasize the specific note we all are missing. We are so grateful to have Carol guiding us.
- And we must mention Barbara. For most of her time at Hudson, we have all been singing in masks, so we rarely get to see her smile. But when she is directing, we often get to hear her beautiful soprano voice singing right along with us. And see the joy and spirit coming through in her eyes. So, while we can't see her singing the words, her eyes are projecting the ministry of her music. It is wonderful and powerful!

We could go on and on but instead we will just say what a gift it is to spend time with each of our friends in the Choir and Handbells. We are humbled to be a part of their community.

In closing, we would like to ask a favor. Everyone really lean-in and sing those hymns each Sunday (or at least hum along)! It doesn't matter which part you sing or whether it is on key or not. It will be pleasing to God's ear. You are all a part of the music ministry at Hudson!

Our names are Carol and Bruce Cox and we are grateful that we get to experience God's spirit at work through the music ministry. We belong to Hudson, to each of you, and to God.

Nursery is Open on Sundays!


Our nursery is open during worship. Your children from birth to 3 years old will be safely taken care of by our compassionate, trained, and responsible childcare workers.

Hudson's Current Policies

The below policies have been set or reviewed by Session, the COVID-19 Sub Team, Personnel Committee or the Hudson Memorial Preschool Board. All below policies are subject to change.

- Church staff can work from the office or at home.
- For preschool drop off, no parents come inside the building.
- The preschool is following NCDHHS tool kit and guidance.
- Groups of any size can gather outside without masks. Eating outside on church property is permitted.
- Masks are required at all times inside the church building. Exceptions to this are:
 - Vaccinated speakers, soloists and small singing groups in worship who are appropriately socially distant from the congregation.
 - Staff who are working alone in their office.
- Sunday worship children's message volunteers must wear masks when giving their talk because the children are not socially distant from the speaker.
- Employees of HMPC (church and preschool) are required to provide proof of their COVID-19 vaccination to their supervisor.
- Any volunteer working with children 12 and under at HMPC will be required to provide proof of their COVID-19 vaccination to the Interim Director of Children and Family Ministries or the Interim Director of Youth Ministries prior to volunteering with children 12 and under.
- Groups are not allowed to eat together inside the church buildings. The exception to this rule is preschool children have lunch and snack time in their class bubble.
