I was baptized and raised in a small Presbyterian church. Bill and I were married in my church, he joined and became involved soon after. Bill served on the Session and I served on the Diaconate. From there we moved to Merrimack, NH and joined the only Presbyterian church in three towns! We enjoyed the company of several young families who had children at about the same time as our son, Greg, was born. We became involved in several committees and social groups within the church.

In 1989, we moved from New Hampshire to Raleigh, NC. It was surprising how many Presbyterian churches there were for us to visit and make a choice for our family to join. We only visited one church that was closer to our home before coming to HMPC. We were warmly welcomed by members of HMPC during that visit and we were soon after visited by the Associate Pastor. We knew that this was the church we wanted to join.

Our faith is sustained by the love and support of our church family at HMPC. We are both involved in several areas of ministry and have developed strong relationships. Daily reflection and prayers are at the core of our faith. Finally, worshiping in this loving place always lifts us up.

More than 40 years ago at our church in Pennsylvania, there was a brief Minute for Mission explaining the benefits of members making bequests in their will for the future of the Church. We have been so blessed in our life by our gracious and loving God and this seemed a natural way to show our support. It will be the one last time that we are able to offer support. Our hope is that this article will encourage others to give this prayerful thought. We do not know what the needs of the church will be at that time, but we trust that our Session will make the best decision on how to use our gift.

A passage that speaks to us about the importance of giving to the Church is 2 Corinthians 9:7:

*“So let each one give as he purposes in his heart,
not grudgingly or of necessity;
for God loves a cheerful giver.”*

During my years serving on Session, I have learned more about what the Foundation at HMPC does and how it supports the work of the church. HMPC has been so blessed to receive bequests that have made a significant difference in the past few years. It will be a gift for us to be able to share the bounty from God that we have at the end of our lives. It is important to us to remember our church and help to support it years into the future.

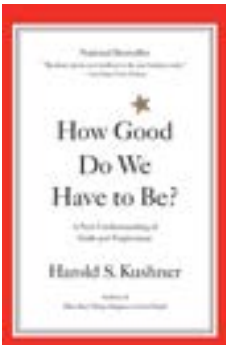

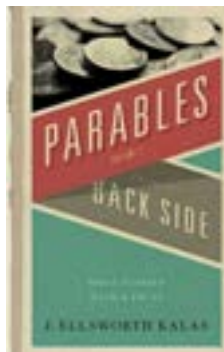

Habitat Interfaith Build

April 30, May 1, June 4

There are still dates left to volunteer with the 2022 Interfaith Build!

For those who may not be familiar, Habitat for Humanity was founded on a commitment to racial equity, reconciliation, and justice. It is a Christian-based organization that seeks to put God's love into action, working with and serving people of all different faiths and walks of life to fulfill its vision of a world in which all God's children have a safe place to live.

Hudson Memorial has a long history with Habitat of Wake County since 1998, when we were the first church to individually sponsor a home. In all these years, we have participated in countless builds, and a decade ago participated in an Abraham Build with members of the Jewish, Islamic and Christian communities. Out of that shared experience was born the Interfaith Coalition which includes more faith communities and groups who share the core belief that loving our neighbor requires commitment to people who are in most need.

HMPC members have found the Interfaith Build a wonderful opportunity to establish relationships with our coalition members as we work alongside one another. This year's coalition participants are: Islamic Association of Raleigh, Sikh Community, Beth Meyer Synagogue, St. Paul's Christian Church, Raleigh Mennonite Church, Highland United Methodist Church, Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Raleigh, Jewish Family Services, Temple Beth Or, Hudson Memorial Presbyterian Church, Unity of the Triangle, Triangle Interfaith Alliance, First Church of Christ Scientist, Hindu Society, Kadampa Center and Sai Center.

Responding to the Crisis in Ukraine

Hudson's Mission Committee has discussed the crisis in Ukraine and how we can respond. Our denomination is already active in this crisis through Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) and long-time partner agencies in Europe.

"Our first priority is to provide funding to these partners on the ground. While the scale of this crisis is new, receiving refugees from Ukraine and other countries in Central and Eastern Europe is not, which means we have trusted, established partners with the knowledge and expertise to carry out this important work."

Children's Faith Formation Library

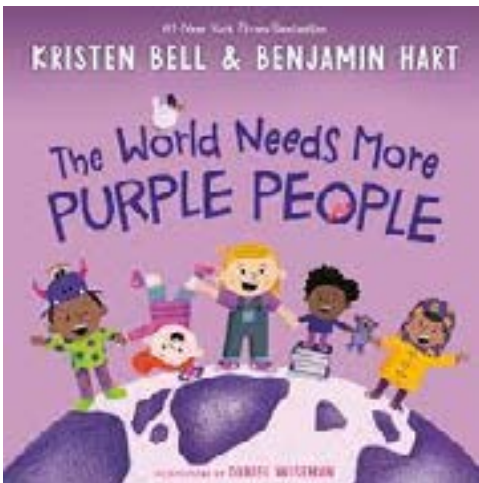

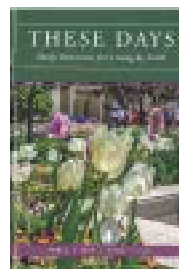
