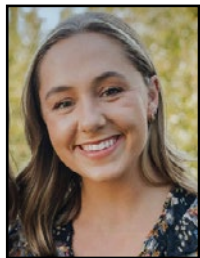


New Director of Youth Ministry MERRITT LIEBMAN

Hi all! I'm Merritt Liebman, and I am thrilled to serve in the role of Youth Director here at Hudson. I grew up at HMPC and am so excited to return in a staff position. My faith has been deeply nurtured by the people of this church, through my time serving on the New Hope Youth Council, through working at conferences at Massanetta Springs and Montreat Conference Center, and through participating in Presbyterian campus ministry at NC State.



My husband, Paul, and I are members of HMPC, and we have two dogs who are not church members but have participated in a pet blessing. For the past few years I have served as Director of Youth Ministries at Wake Forest Presbyterian Church, where my love for youth ministry and sense of calling were affirmed. 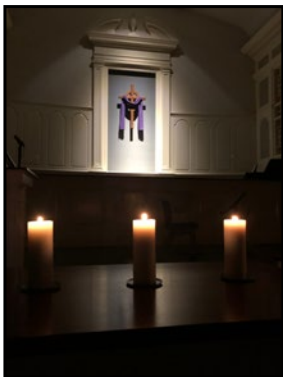
Lenten Sermon Theme

FEBRUARY 22 - MARCH 29: "FULFILLMENT"

The sermon series explores the idea of fulfillment - that word that many younger Americans use to describe what they're looking for in marriage and career, and the idea of God's vision for humankind coming to fruition - especially through Jesus Christ. Holy Week Updates for 2026

Friends, we wanted to let you know that at their last committee meeting, the Worship team decided not to have the Good Friday noon time worship service this year. We based the decision on two sets of numbers: the number of full-time pastoral staff we currently have, and the numbers of people who have been attending the service. Both are lower than we think they need to be to support this service in addition to our other planned Holy Week services - Maundy Thursday Tenebrae, ecumenical Easter Sunrise and two HMPC Easter Sunday services. Since Easter is on the first Sunday of April this year, Session also approved the Worship team recommendation for moving the sacrament of communion to the following Sunday, April 12. HMPC has traditionally chosen to do this. We appreciate all who would rather have communion on Easter, as well as those who've made the effort to attend the Good Friday service over the years. 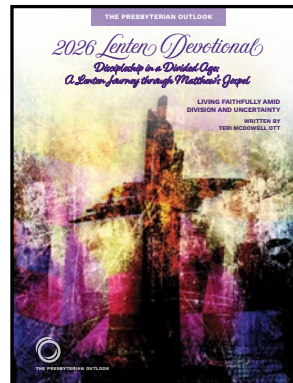

2026 Lenten Devotional: Discipleship in a Divided Age BY TERI MCDOWELL OTT

In a world marked by division, uncertainty and competing narratives, Matthew's Gospel speaks with striking relevance. Matthew's first audience — a young, fragile community navigating conflict, identity and fear — sounds a lot like the church today. This Lenten devotional by *Presbyterian Outlook* editor Teri McDowell Ott invites readers to journey through Matthew's Gospel to discover how Jesus leads us toward humility, courage, compassion and faithful discipleship amid the fractures of our age.

Grounded in Scripture and written with pastoral warmth, this resource guides individuals and congregations through daily reflections, including a weekly *visio divina* practice. Each entry includes Scripture, a focus verse, a theologically rich reflection, guided questions, and a closing prayer — making it ideal for personal prayer, small groups, session devotions, or congregational Lenten study.

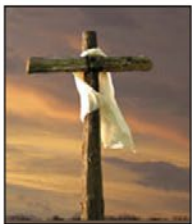

TRANSITIONAL MINISTRY

Mission Study Report Approved

Hudson's Mission Study Report, approved by Session last week, has now been approved by the Commission on Ministry of the Presbytery of New Hope, unanimously and without discussion. This paves the way for Session to create a Pastor Nominating Committee.

The Mission Study Report will be available for the congregation to read in the next few weeks. There will also be opportunities for the congregation to learn more about the report in discussions with church leaders. **Read the Window in upcoming weeks for announcements about when these will happen!**

The Mission Study Report includes the goals that emerged from our Brunch Church sessions, with a recommendation for Session to develop priorities among those goals, as well as to create the SAM criteria (Specific, Attainable, and Measurable) for the top goals and objectives. Once Session approves that way forward, they will delegate to the committees responsible for the various objectives the actual work to start guiding HMPC into fulfilling its vision.

This marks the end of the mission study phase of the pastoral transition process. The MST will be dismissed with thanks by Session, but team members will remain available for questions anyone has about the report. The next phase we're entering is the nominating phase, and that will be led first by the Session's nominating subcommittee, and then by the Pastor Nominating Committee once it is elected.

Children's Music Director

As many of you know, our Children's Music Director, Rich Richards, concluded his 4.5 years of joyful leadership in December. We are deeply grateful for the creativity, energy, and care he shared with our children during his time at Hudson. In the interim, we have been blessed by the leadership of Sarah Bedini.

We are now beginning the search for a permanent Joyful Noise Children's Music Director. We are looking for someone who can provide a fun, faith-filled, and musically rich experience for children ages 5–10. We are seeking a person who loves working with children, encourages joyful participation, and helps young voices grow in confidence while discovering music as an expression of worship. The role involves leading weekly rehearsals, preparing children to sing in worship throughout the year, collaborating closely with staff and families, and nurturing a welcoming, life-giving musical community.

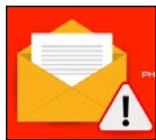

New Texting Scam

Impersonations of Pastor Marguerite Requests for gift cards



We want to make you aware of a text message scam that has affected several members of our congregation.

Some people have received text messages that appear to come from Pastor Marguerite, but these messages are not actually from her. Scammers are able to make a message look like it comes from a familiar name on your phone—this is called “spoofing.”

Please know this:

Pastor Marguerite and the church will never text you asking for money or gift cards.

What These Scam Messages May Look Like

Scam texts often:

- Come “out of the blue”
- Say things like “Are you available?” or “I need a favor”
- Continue only by text (calling the number usually goes to a full voicemail)
- Eventually ask for gift cards or money
- Any mention of gift cards is a major red flag.

The church would only ever mention gift cards in very specific, public ways—such as in a newsletter or on a bulletin board, as part of a mission collection for PCM or a similar drive—never through a personal text message.

What To Do If You Receive a Message Like This

- Do not reply to the text
- Do not send money or gift cards
- If you are unsure, write a new email (do not reply to the text) to Pastor Marguerite at: msirrinc@hmhc.org and ask if the message was truly from her.

Scams like this are one of the reasons we removed the church directory from our website and have strengthened other online safety measures. Thank you for helping keep yourself and our church community safe. If you ever have questions, please don’t hesitate to reach out.

January Property Summary

WHAT DID WE ACCOMPLISH IN JANUARY?

- Continued an ongoing project from December after
a leak was discovered in the ceiling of the 2nd Floor
Library (Air Handler 13 as part of our HVAC system).
Replacement part delivery took longer than we would
have liked, and in the interim, Hannah and Dorothy
managed the leak with a bucket system! The repair
required TriSouth to go into the attic space above the
preschool.
- Ken Krause and Hannah are currently addressing
resulting water damage to ceiling tiles and insulation.
- Completed routine winter property care, including
sidewalk treatment during freezing conditions.
Sidewalk treatments were performed both by our
landscapers and by Todd Wadford. Remember to tell
him, "Thank you, Todd!"
- Continued regular lawn care and cleaning services.
